Computing


Preparing for Adulthood

<u>Award</u>

1. Written examination

This exam will initially be taken in January the title for the exam is Contemporary Issues in Sport.

2. Active participation

Pupils will take part in both individual and team activities, pupils will also be expected to show competence in officiating a game. To complete this unit pupils will evaluate and create sessions to improve their skills in a chosen sport.

AQA GCSE course.

The course is designed to give you a wide variety of opportunities to include:

- Drawing
- Painting
- Printmaking
- Textiles
- 3D work

The course consists of one sustained project. The theme will be set by the teacher and will run through years 9, 10 and 11 with a few mini projects.

The exam paper is given to students in the January of year 11 and pupils have 6 weeks to prepare before creating a final Art Work over 10 hours.

There will be a selection of themes to choose from set by the exam board.

Please note that you will be expected to work at home on ideas, preparation, research, collecting information as well as drawing and sketching.



Animal Care

In Animal Care students will explore and learn about many different species of animal. Emphasis is based around the five-animal welfare needs and how we ensure those needs are maintained.

The subject lends itself to off site visits to various settings to include pet shops, farms and sanctuaries just to name a few.

There is the opportunity to experience handling many different types of animals in the centre from reptiles to cuddly mammals.

Qualifications in this subject range from entry level up to Level 1 and the subject can easily be tailored to suit individual needs. Students will undertake a variety of ABC units.
